Dear Parents and Carers,

Thank you for your support during the previous NEU strike days. You may be aware that many teaching unions have rejected the current pay offer from the Department for Education, based on the grounds that any pay increase will not be funded by central government but will be placed on schools to fund from existing budgets. This clearly places an additional strain onto schools, at a time when budgets will have been planned to support the education of the pupils as much as possible.

The NEU have also announced two additional strike days in the foreseeable future, with most other teaching Unions reballoting about Strike action later in the academic year. The two new dates announced are **Thursday 27th April and Tuesday 2nd May.**

We have a very high number of staff members in the relevant Union, meaning that it is not possible to staff the school fully. After careful consideration of the information currently available to us and a risk assessment of health and safety and safeguarding factors, we have made the decision that **The Stonehenge School will be closed to Year 7, 8, 9 and 10 students on Thursday 27**th **April and Tuesday 2**nd **May.**

We will only be open to Year 11 and vulnerable pupils on those dates. There will be no Period 6 however.

School will be open to the following students:

• **Year 11 students** (who will be preparing for their GCSEs during the whole day, and therefore should be in attendance as per usual).

If you are in receipt of Free school meals and your child is in a year group remaining at home we will write to you seperately with a form to complete to request food in advance.

Dean B.A. (Hons), NPQH If your child is attending school due to being in one of the above categories, a range of food and snacks will be available to be purchased from the canteen at both break and lunch, alternatively students can bring their own packed lunches.

Due to teachers striking, they will not be in a position to lead remote learning sessions, therefore, students at home are asked to consolidate their work and ensure they are up to date with all homework. Year 10 students are asked to continue to prepare revision resources for their courses and ensure they are up to date across all their subjects.

If members of staff are not striking, they will organise additional learning through ClassCharts. Therefore, all students are also asked to check the system to see if further work has been set.

Whilst we are aware the strike action taken is not against the school we are very sorry for the disruption this will cause you.

Finally, can I take this opportunity to thank you for your understanding.

Vulnerable children and young people

Vulnerable children and young people include those who:

- are assessed as being in need under section 17 of the Children Act 1989, including children and young people who have a child in need plan, a child protection plan or who are a looked-after child
- have an education, health and care (EHC) plan
- have been identified as otherwise vulnerable by educational providers or local authorities (including children's social care services), and who could therefore benefit from continued full-time attendance. This might include:
 - children and young people on the edge of receiving support from children's social care services or in the process of being referred to children's services or who have previously received support from children's social care services (as identified by local authorities)
 - adopted children or children on a special guardianship order
 - those living in temporary accommodation
 - those who are young carers
 - care leavers
 - children and young people in a family circumstance presenting challenges for them, such as drug and alcohol misuse, parental offending, adult mental health issues and domestic abuse
