We are thrilled to introduce a new format for our annual Sports Day, now called the 'Sports Festival', designed to involve and engage more students in a wider variety of activities. Considering our school's increasing size and rising costs, we have revamped the Sports Festival to ensure it continues to be a key event in our school calendar.

New Venue and Format

This year, the Sports Festival will take place at Holders Road Playing Fields, our secure and well-maintained grounds. This new format enables us to provide a variety of activities (refer to the attachment for this year's organised events) that appeal to a broader spectrum of interests, encouraging more students to take part and enjoy the activities.

Event Details:

·10:00 - 14:30: Holders Playing Fields.

Students will compete in House tournaments/events and choose from various activities in specially designated areas.

Important Information:

Sports Festival - Food Availability for FSM Students

Please complete the form on the link below for your child's free school meal choice on Sports Day - Friday 19th July. All forms need to be returned by 16th July. <u>https://forms.office.com/e/UpwALpNJAz</u>

The hot food token will allow your child to get a burger, vegetarian burger or hotdog from the food van. If your child would prefer we can offer a sandwich bag instead.

There will be water available at the field but please be aware that your child will may need cash if they wish to purchase ice creams or additional food from the burger van.

Food available on Sports Day

We have a variety of food vans on Holders Field on the day where food such as burgers and icecreams can be purchased or your child can pre-order a sandwich bag on ParentPay if they would prefer a cold lunch.

Hot Food

We have a burger van selling Hot dogs @ £2.50, Burgers @ £3.50 or a Vegetarian burger @ £3.50. Various ice creams will also be on sale from £2.00 up to £3.50 These can be purchased on the day with cash or a debit card.

Cold Food

You just need to choose which bag your child would like (Sandwich Bag 1, 2 or Baguette bag) and make payment on ParentPay. Once purchased your child will receive a form to chose their choice of sandwich etc.

RACE TO THE LINE

The Race To The Line competition objective is simple: Student teams must design and make the fastest rocket powered car they can and compete with to find the winner!

Every team's car will use the same methods of propulsion and compete over the same track distance. The winning teams on race days will have the cars that have the most efficient aerodynamics, have lower mass and that have safe, well designed wheels that reduce friction and can survive the forces of a high-speed run.

Every student in the challenge can have an opportunity to refine their designs. The key challenges for student teams are:

• to shape and adapt the foam block into the most aerodynamic and lightweight shape possible within the safety guidelines and rules. They can explore adding fairings and aerodynamic stabilizers as needed to reduce drag and improve stability if they think they will help,

- to create efficient wheels and axles that are safe and strong and meet competition size limits,
- to develop a precision timing solution to measure the performance of their cars,
- to devise and carry out tests to evaluate, refine and improve their designs.





The start of the work taking place over the summer starting with the refurbishment of the middle school toilets. This will bring them up to the standard we have in our new buildings and improve the student facilities.







Last weekend, 13 Year 10 students set off on their qualifying expedition for the Silver Duke of Edinburgh award. They had to walk for several miles each day, navigating the route for themselves, and camping each night. Here is Abigail's experience:

• Day one: On day one, we started from a car park in the New Forest. We followed a marked trail through woods and fields. We also took a short cut which ended up to not be a short cut as we found ourselves in a knee deep bog. Early on, we faced a navigational error that led to a huge detour. This tested our problemsolving skills and patience but ultimately strengthened our teamwork. Although it was hard, tiring, cold and wet, spirits where still high and we were still smiling.

- Day 2: This was the longest day, we reached the top of significant hills, providing breath-taking views of the forest and wildlife. We saw the Portuguese Fireplace, some beautiful rivers, streams and lakes.
- Day 3: A combination of woodland paths and open moorland leading to our final checkpoint. Everyone was mentally and physically exhausted but we kept smiling thanks to the terrible jokes, singing and games of Uno. We kept pushing through all the rain and the wind until the very end where we all raced each other back to the bus.

My Silver DofE expedition was a transformative experience that pushed my physical and mental boundaries. It highlighted the importance of preparation, teamwork, and resilience. The challenges faced and overcome have instilled a greater sense of confidence and an appreciation for the outdoors. We laughed and almost cried, but mainly laughed. We overcame many obstacles and achieved goals.

Students are now busy planning a presentation on their experience, which is their final task.

We run both Bronze and Silver Duke of Edinburgh experiences for our students and we will be launching this for Year 9 and Year 10 students in the next academic year. Watch this space!

FUEL Programme

FUEL is the holiday activity and food programme (HAF) that is funded by the Department of Education. FUEL provides eligible school-aged children with free access to enriching activities, nutritious meals and healthy eating information during the Easter, Summer and Christmas holidays.

The HAF programme is delivered in Wiltshire using the brand FUEL (Food, Unity, Energy, Laughter) and the programme is a direct response to the growing issue of holiday hunger.

Who is eligible for the FUEL Programme?

The FUEL Programme a bespoke provision for school aged children from reception to year 11 who receive benefit-related free school meals.

Benefits-related free school meals (FSM) are available to pupils if their parents are in receipt of one of the qualifying benefits, and have a claim verified by their school or local authority.

Further information on eligibility for Free school meals.

The FUEL Programme is also available to children that meet any of the below:

• children that are refugees

• children that are currently in the care system

• young carers

• children that are referred into the programme by a professional service (eg. Local authority, schools, social service) For further enquiries, please email fuelprogramme@wiltshire.gov.uk(opens new window).

FAQs

How do I know if my child is eligible for FUEL activities?

Information about eligibility can be found on the FUEL Programme web page.

My child has Free School Meals in school because they are in Reception Class or a KS1 Class. Are they eligible for FUEL?

No. Your child is only eligible for FUEL if they would be entitled to benefit related Free School Meals. Information about eligibility is on the FUEL Programme web page.

Do I have to sign my child up for every day of the activity programme?

No, you can sign your child up fo<mark>r as many o</mark>r a<mark>s few</mark> days as you would like for t<mark>hem t</mark>o attend.

My child has food allergies and/or other dietary requirements; how are these catered for?

Please make sure that you highlight any of these when you complete your child's details. Our food provider can cater for food allergies and intolerances. The information about dietary requirements will be shared with them and activity providers.

I have changed my mind about the activities and dates I have selected for my child; how do I let activity providers know?

You can alter your bookings on the FUEL booking page. Wiltshire Council will pass that information on to activity providers.

My child's medical information details have changed since I set up my account and made bookings; how do I make changes to these?

You can make changes in the FUEL booking system. Any changes you make will be passed to food and activity providers as appropriate.

I booked a place for my child some time ago but it is showing as 'requested', what does that mean?

It means that the information is still being checked and has not been passed to the activity provider for follow up. The space is still reserved in our system.

Can I book more than one activity per day?

You can only book one activity per day per child.

I am trying to book activities for my child but I cannot see their name when I go into an activity, why is that?

If your child's name does not appear, then it is probably because you have made changes to their details. You need to access the child's details via the Summary page and re-confirm their details.

I have tried to book my child on to an activity but the ones I am interested are now full. Can I be added to a waiting list?

You can express an interest in an activity that is fully booked, using the booking system. We will contact you if a space becomes available. Please do still book spaces on alternative activities if they are available.
