Hockey Masters World Cup

Some of you might remember that before the October half- term, I was lucky enough to travel to South Africa to play in the Over 35s Masters Hockey World Cup. My first experience of a World Cup at Masters level was bitter sweet. After preparing for months leading up to the competition and hoping for a higher placed finish, we were disappointed that we had to settle for 9th place overall. Although our opening game against South Africa ended in defeat, I will never forget the experience of playing the home team in their opening game of the tournament. To play against such an experienced team, with 6 Olympians and a total of 1,355 combined senior caps, to hold them to 2-0 was an incredible experience. Our game against the Argentinians ended in a 1-0 defeat, conceding due to a defensive error, was a tough pill to swallow. We finished the last group game with a 4-0 win over Australia IMC. The margins were so fine that even though we only conceded three goals in the whole tournament and scored ninteteen, we were still moved to the bottom half of the draw, fighting it out for 9th place. The placing matches saw us beat Hong Kong 1-0, beat France 8-0 and beat Wales 6-0. I even managed to score my first goal for Ireland in the game against France.

And even though we did not finish as high on the table as we would have liked to, it was truly a magnificent experience and one I will never forget. A huge thank you to those that made it possible for me to have this experience and the school for their incredible support leading up to and during the tournament.
