Headteacher's Message -

As a school community, we have been working closely with Jake's family and friends to organise a number of events in the coming months to fundraise and celebrate Jake's life. We are incredibly proud to be a part of these efforts and are looking forward to a range of activities that will both honour Jake's memory and support an important cause.

Some of the plans include a memorial garden within the school grounds, a time capsule, tree planting, and some exciting wholeschool physical challenges involving both pupils and staff. We are also looking forward to hosting our first 'Blue Day'—a day where we will wear blue, eat blue food, and enjoy blue lollies, all in honour of Jake's favourite colour.

Army Flying Museum in Middle Wallop for the Leonardo STEM Day

On Tuesday, January 28, 2025, thirty of our Year 8 students embarked on a journey to the Army Flying Museum in Middle Wallop for the Leonardo STEM Day - a free event designed to ignite passion for aerospace technology through interactive activities.

The day commenced with an "Engine Build" session, where students delved into the distinctions between petrol and gas engines. Divided into teams, they raced against the clock to assemble engine models, akin to intricate 3D puzzles. Amazingly, the fastest teams completed their builds in just eight seconds, showcasing impressive teamwork and problemsolving skills.

Next, students explored a Scout helicopter, gaining insights into rotor mechanics and the design considerations for engine cooling in jet engines. They had the unique opportunity to sit in the helicopter's cockpit and manipulate the rotors, providing a hands-on understanding of helicopter dynamics.

The "Apache Talk" featured Jim, a former Army pilot who earned his wings in 2009 and now trains others to fly Apaches at Boeing. He explained the principles of rotor lift, emphasizing Newton's third law, and compared various helicopter designs, such as attack helicopters versus casualty evacuation models. Discussions encompassed weaponry like wire-guided missiles and the advanced optics of the Apache, including uranium-crystal heat cameras and high-magnification day cameras capable of targeting up to 10 kilometres away. Students also examined 30mm bullets used by Apaches, learning about their design and firing capabilities.

In the "Helicopter Design" session, students tackled different mission scenarios—search and rescue, VIP evacuation, and attack operations. Tasked with designing a helicopter under £28 million, they selected from various design cards, balancing factors like weight, cost, and special features, fostering creativity and strategic thinking.

The excitement soared with VR headset experiences. One simulation placed students in a hangar, preparing a helicopter for take-off, while the other allowed them to pilot a helicopter virtually, offering immersive insights into aerospace operations.

A session led by aerospace engineers from Leonardo delved into the essence of engineering. Students discovered that engineering encompasses design across various domains, with examples all around them-from clocks to buildings. The discussion highlighted educational pathways into engineering and the qualities essential for success in the field, such as inventiveness, logic, curiosity, collaboration, and resourcefulness. They also learned about Leonardo's role in developing technologies like electronics, radar, cyber systems, lasers, and infrared cameras.

At the "Wind Table" station, students crafted paper helicopters from templates and tested them on a wind table, observing how added weight affected stability and spin rate, thereby understanding principles of flight and centre of gravity.

The day concluded with a talk on the Auster MK9 plane, detailing its features and operational challenges in Asian terrains. Students learned about survival tactics, aircraft manoeuvring, and the historical context of aviation, including insights into the Sopwith plane from 1916 and pilot tactics during that era.

This immersive experience not only deepened our students' understanding of aerospace technology but also inspired many to consider future careers in engineering. We extend our gratitude to the Army Flying Museum and Leonardo Helicopters for facilitating such an enriching and engaging day.




