Stonehenge School Students Explore Real-World Mathematics at Disneyland Paris Conference

Earlier this month, 40 Year 10 students from Stonehenge School set off on an exciting three-day educational trip to Disneyland Paris, with the highlight being their attendance at the NST Maths LIVE! Conference. The event provided students with a unique opportunity to engage with mathematics outside the classroom, exploring how maths is applied in various industries, including finance, physics, and even theme park design.

Day 1: The Journey Begins

The group set off in the early hours of Sunday morning, departing from school just after midnight. After a late-night stop at Maidstone services and a two-hour wait for the ferry in Dover, the students finally set sail at 7:10 am. While some students enjoyed their complimentary breakfast on board, others found the choppy waters a little less enjoyable!

Upon arrival in France, the group made their way to Disney's Hotel Cheyenne, where they quickly dropped off their luggage before heading straight into the parks for the afternoon. Students were given time to explore and engage in self-directed learning, with some applying mathematical concepts to real-world problems within the theme park, while others enjoyed the attractions. A group of students gathered along Main Street, U.S.A. to watch the Disney parade, while others focused on solving maths-based tasks designed to enhance their learning experience.

The day ended with a group dinner at Billy Bob's Tex-Mex Buffet, where students refuelled after their long journey before heading back to the hotel for a well-earned rest.

Day 2: Maths LIVE! Conference - Bringing Mathematics to Life

After an early breakfast, the group made use of their Magic Hour–an exclusive time slot for Disney hotel guests–to enjoy the parks before the general public arrived. At 4:00 pm, the students gathered at the Gaumont Cinema in Disney Village for the highly anticipated NST Maths LIVE! Conference, which featured an impressive lineup of expert speakers:

Jon Chase (Science Communicator & STEM Rapper) - Kicked off the conference with an engaging session on how maths is present in everyday life, including its use in theme park rides and engineering. He also performed a STEM rap that captivated the audience.

Alex Bellos (Author & Puzzle Enthusiast) - Presented a series of mathematical puzzles designed to challenge logical thinking. One of his brainteasers, a cleverly worded sentence with hidden mistakes, had students debating whether it was true or false.

Kia Commodore (Financial Literacy Expert) - Delivered a crucial session on money management, focusing on budgeting, simple vs. compound interest, and how retailers use mathematical tricks to influence consumer spending. This session proved particularly insightful as students learned real-life skills that will benefit them in their future financial decisions.

Matt Pritchard (Mathemagician & Physicist) - Provided a fascinating demonstration of mathematical illusions, optical tricks, and how Disneyland Paris uses forced perspective to create visual effects, such as making Sleeping Beauty's Castle appear larger than it actually is.

The conference concluded with a Q&A session, allowing students to ask questions and gain further insight into the diverse career opportunities that mathematics can offer.

After the conference, students had time to enjoy the park's attractions before gathering for the Disney Illuminations show–a spectacular mix of fireworks, music, and lights that illuminated Sleeping Beauty's Castle. Although slightly foggy, the dazzling display was a perfect way to end an inspiring day of learning.

Day 3: Homeward Bound

After another early breakfast, students checked out of the hotel and boarded the coach for the journey home. A highlight of the return trip was a stop at duty-free shopping in Calais, where many students picked up discounted souvenirs, including LEGO sets and sweets.

The group boarded the ferry at 3:15 pm French time, and despite the busy journey, spirits remained high. Upon arriving back in the UK at 3:34 pm, the final leg of the journey back to school was smooth, with all students safely collected by 7:30 pm.

A Valuable Educational Experience

This trip was not just about the excitement of Disneyland but also about seeing how mathematics is embedded in the world around us. The NST Maths LIVE! Conference gave students the opportunity to engage with experts and learn about the real-world applications of maths in ways that were both engaging and inspiring.

The Stonehenge School is proud to offer students these enriching experiences, demonstrating that learning extends beyond the classroom. The trip was a resounding success, and we look forward to hopefully offering similar opportunities in the future!




Year 7 Stonehenge Girls Rugby Team vs. Trafalgar First Fixture of the Season
