





Lunar Eclipse 14th March

There is a lunar eclipse on the morning of the 14th March (it starts at 3.57 and is at its peak at 6.19), one of two eclipses to take place this month.

A lunar eclipse takes place during a full Moon when the Earth blocks the light from the Sun reaching the Moon, at the height of the eclipse the Moon becomes a blood Moon as only the longer red light can refract around the curve of the Earth.


SCHOOL TRIPS

Here is a guide from UCAS about contextual offers. If you don't meet the criteria for contextual offers, there may still be scholarships, grants and bursaries that you are eligible for. You can learn more and find opportunities on The Scholarship Hub. If you're still deciding whether or not university is for you, we would recommend taking part in a University Summer School. This allows you to and see what uni life is like. You can find a lot of opportunities using UniTasterDays or search the name of a specific university that you're interested in followed by the term "summer school' to find more information. From High School to Uni's student guide is designed to be your ultimate companion to help you transition to university. From not knowing what to pack, to how to get organised preparing for university, or even how to create a budget to help you plan and manage your finances. Tescos and The King's Trust have come together to bring you the "Stronger Starts Retail Apprenticeship" programme. The apprenticeship is delivered entirely in store and takes a minimum of 12 months to complete. You'll spend time doing a range of activities such as marketing, business and technology and completing learning on a tablet device you're provided with. This is a level 2 apprenticeship, which is equivalent to 5 GCSE passes. You can read more here.



Why am I being given this flyer?

Because it's currently against the law to ride an electric scooter on a public road, pavement or public space - such as a car park or play park.

Wiltshire Police Roads Policing Unit, the Road Safety Unit, Youth and Early Intervention Teams, and the Office for the Police and Crime Commissioner are offering information to help you make informed choices when it comes to e-scooters and e-bikes.

When making your way round your community, including going to school, you might be using your own transport of some kind - such as pedal cycles or a scooter.

We want to share important information with you about e-scooters and e-bikes, including where you can use them and what the Police can do if they see you riding them illegally.

What is an e-scooter?

Electrical scooters (also known as e-scooters) come under the category of "powered transporters". This covers a range of personal transport devices which are powered by a motor. Examples include:

- Segways
- Powered unicycles
- Hoverboards
- U Wheels
- Go-Peds
- **■** E-Scooters

E-scooters are classed as motor vehicles under the Road Traffic Act 1988. Which means the rules that apply to motor vehicles, also

apply to e-scooters, including the need to have a licence, insurance and tax. If you cause serious harm to another person whilst riding an e-scooter the incident will be investigated in the same way as if you were riding a motorcycle or driving a car.

Can I use my e-scooter when I go to school / out with my mates?

No. It is currently illegal (against the law) to use them on the roads/pavements or in public spaces, this includes publicly accessed areas, such as car parks and play parks. If you're riding your e-scooter in one of these places, you will risk it being seized under \$.165 Road Traffic Act 1988 and you won't get it back.

Where can I use my e-Scooter?

You can use an e-scooter on private land with the permission of the land/homeowner, this includes your own home and garden.

However, even there, if police receive a complaint, they will investigate for using the e-bike/e-scooter/board in an anti-social manner. This means if the use of the e-bike / e-scooter / board is causing alarm, harassment or distress to others around you, the Police can take it from you and seize it under section 59 of the Police Reform Act.
